Year 3 Football skills



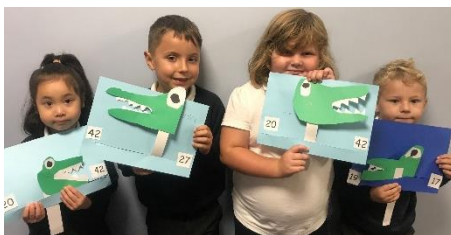
