Mrs Walker's Historians

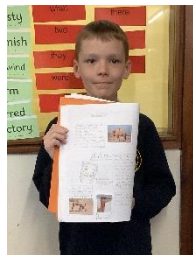

School Office Reception area

Our school office is open for parents from 8.30-4.00pm. We would like to remind parents and carers not to sit in the reception area just outside the school office before school starts and before it ends. There are several reasons why we ask parents **not** to use this space unless they really need to speak to someone in the office:

- Many parents need to come into this space to talk to someone in the office privately and do not feel comfortable doing so in front of other parents or children.
- Parents and children have also, at times, blocked access to and from school for staff or visitors trying to enter or leave the building (with buggies, bikes, scooters, shopping bags etc)
- It is unfair for some parents to be inside when the weather is poor, when others have to wait outside.
- If there are too many people in this area, (as shown by our monitor) the air quality is substantially reduced.

Please avoid this area of school if at all possible, as we do not want to cause offence by asking people to move. Many thanks for your cooperation with this.
