

<p>English</p> 	<p>In English our lessons will be based on the story of 'How the Stars Came to Be' by Poonam Mistry. This is a fiction text and will provide many opportunities to develop our skills of oral story telling. We will begin to explore and develop an insight into the culture and history of origin stories whilst comparing with other creation tales from around the World. We will structure and write our own adaptations of a creation story.</p>
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>In Year 3 this half term, we will be learning how to find fractions of objects and amounts. We will also be working on multiplying and dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number. In Year 4 this half term, we will be learning how to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. We will also be solving problems involving multiplication and division. As always, we will be working on our times tables and encourage you to practise these at home.</p>
<p>Science</p> 	<p>In Science we will be learning about Electricity. We will start by looking at the appliances that run on both mains and battery-powered electricity. Next, we will be exploring simple electrical circuits and identifying and naming the various components that make them work. Finally, we will be investigating how switches work and also testing materials that make good conductors and insulators of electricity. This should be a really exciting topic!</p>
<p>History</p> 	<p>Our History focus this half term will look at the Anglo-Saxon period of British History. We will be exploring the reasons behind the Anglo-Saxon invasion on British shores from mainland Europe following the Romans' departure. We will be investigating the types of settlements and communities established by the Anglo Saxons and what daily life was like living during those times.</p>
<p>Home School Partnership</p> 	<p>We would like you to help your child at home with the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• listen to your child read at least three times each week and then discuss what has been read to develop their understanding;• practise weekly spellings;• practise times tables on 'Times Tables Rock Stars' <p>A variety of different computer activities are also available for your child to access via the school website.</p>
